 - May 4
 - May 19
 - June 2
 - June 16
- Based on metrics
- Counties can be more, but not less, restrictive

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State Re-Opening Plan

- Metrics include:

DISEASE SPREAD	HOSPITALS	DEATHS
<p>Stable or declining over a 14-day period. Rate of COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population.</p>	<p>Decreasing number of new COVID-19 admissions. Stable (flat) or a downward trajectory of the COVID-19 in-patient counts within a 14-day period.</p>	<p>Decreasing number of deaths. Downward trajectory of COVID-19 deaths within a 14-day period.</p>

KDHE will publish routine data on these metrics by county.

- State recommends that local governments monitor the same criteria as they move through stages of re-opening locally
 - The state will not force communities to reopen

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State Re-Opening Plan

- Phase one business guidelines:
 - Maintain at least six feet between consumers
 - Fundamental cleaning practices
 - Must avoid any instances in which groups of more than 10 are in one location and are unable to maintain six-foot separation

- Legislative Coordinating Council meeting right now to decide how the end of session looks
 - Do they come back?
 - What do they consider when they come back?
 - How do they conduct their business if they come back?
- Still no indication on when delivery fee answer will be coming from CMS

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Testing



- Emergency Use Authorizations (EUA)
 - No new point of care tests provided EUA since Abbott Lab ID Now test on March 27, 2020
- Three tests for point of care are all molecular tests that require specific test beds for processing outside of the clinical lab setting:
 - Abbott ID Now COVID-19
 - Mesa Biotech Accula SARS-CoV-2 Test
 - Cepheid Xpert Xpress SARS-CoV-2 Test

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Testing – Preparing to Test

- Fill out your CLIA Waiver Application CMS-116
 - Make sure to identify specific COVID-19 tests you will be performing a
 - Include estimated number of tests to administer
- Medicare Part B
 - 855A for sole proprietorships
 - 855B for anyone else
 - Right now fees are being waived under the 1135 waiver and days to process are at under 7 days, as compared to average of 3 months before

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Testing – Preparing to Test

- COVID-19 Uninsured Program Portal
 - HHS providing claims reimbursement to health care providers for testing uninsured
 - Good for testing provided after February 4, 2020
 - Limited to available funding
 - Steps include:
 - Enrolling
 - Checking patient eligibility
 - Submitting patient info
 - Submitting claims
 - Receiving payment via direct deposit

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Testing – Preparing to Test

- COVID-19 Uninsured Program Portal
 - To participate you must attest:
 - You have verified patient's uninsured status
 - You will accept defined program reimbursement as payment in full
 - You will not balance bill the patient
 - You agree to terms and conditions and may be subject to audit review
 - What's covered
 - Specimen collection, diagnostic and antibody testing
 - Testing related visits
 - Treatment
 - FDA-approved vaccine, when available

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Testing – Preparing to Test



- PPE
